**Subject: your confirmatory application under Regulation 1049/2001 regarding public access to documents – GESTDEM 2011/5046**

Dear Ms Batko-Toluc,

I refer to your e-mail of 31 October 2011, registered on 8 November 2011, in which you submit a confirmatory application in accordance with Regulation (EC) No 1049/2001 of the European Parliament and of the Council regarding public access to European Parliament, Council and Commission documents<sup>1</sup> (hereafter: Regulation 1049/2001). You request a review of the position taken by the Directorate-General for Information Society and Media (hereafter DG INFSO) on 21 October 2011, in reply to your initial request for access to documents of 3 October 2011.

I also refer to our letter dated 29 November 2011 by which the time limit for handling your application was extended by 15 additional working days, pursuant to Article 8(2) of the Regulation 1049/2001.

In addition, I refer to my decision of 21 December 2011, sent to you on the same day, by which you were provided with full versions of 6 documents originating from the Commission. In this decision, I have however reserved my position with regard to four documents originating from Poland.

Having re-consulted the Polish authorities with regard to these four documents, I am pleased to inform you that, following their answer received on 13 January 2012, I hereby disclose all four documents, as specified in my decision of 21 December 2011, copies of which are enclosed to this decision, i.e.:
