Subject: Your application for access to documents – Ref GestDem No 2012/1502

We refer to your e-mail dated 20/02/2012 in which you make a request for access to documents.

Your application concerns the following documents:

• All correspondence and minutes of meetings between European Commissioner Olli Rehn, his cabinet and DG ECFIN staff and private sector companies and lobby groups since January 1st 2011 (including meetings that took place in the context of the Troika' of which the European Commission is part (together with the IMf and the ECB) on issues related to Greece, Portugal and Ireland.

Having examined the documents requested under the provisions of Regulation (EC) No 1049/2001 regarding public access to documents, I have come to the conclusion that they may be partially disclosed. Some parts of the documents have been blanked out as their disclosure is prevented by exceptions to the right of access laid down in Article 4 of this Regulation.

The expunged parts of the documents contain commercially sensitive information. Disclosure of these parts would undermine the protection of commercial interests of a natural or legal person.
