Art. 4.1(b) Representatives of Huawei paid to [REDACTED] a courtesy meeting in order to introduce the new person in charge of relations with the EU Delegation in their Beijing office [REDACTED] and discuss on trade and investment facilitation and digital trade.
We were ask to explain the difference between the EU Delegation and the Member States Embassies in terms of trade-related work.
On investment facilitation, Huawei recognised that the amount of Chinese ODI in 2015 might have generated certain concerns. They referred to the EU foreign investment screening mechanism and mentioned they do not have any concern with it if brings transparency and predictability.
There was also a short discussion on WTO's negotiations on e-commerce and they have agreed to share their white paper on digital trade/e-commerce.
The representatives of Huawei also briefly explained their relations with EU industry in Europe (BusinessEurope and Digital Europe) and both in China (EUCCC).
