Subject: Your application for access to documents - Ref GestDem No 2020/4885

Dear Mr Carvalho,

I refer to your request for access to documents under Regulation (EC) No 1049/2001<sup>1</sup> ("Regulation 1049/2001") relating to information about meetings between DG TRADE and the European Automobile Manufacturers' Association (ACEA). Your request has been registered under the reference number GestDem No 2020/4885.

In your request, you asked for a list of all meetings between ACEA and DG Trade officials from January 2019 to the present day. For the same period, you also requested all documents relating to meetings and/ or communications between ACEA and DG Trade officials whose subject concerned cross-sectoral supply chain due diligence obligations in relation to human rights and environmental impacts.

Regarding the first part of your request, the relevant information is stored in the database Events Management Tool (EMT), which is an electronic tool for keeping track of

meetings of Commission officials with external stakeholders. The data range concerned was therefore extracted from the EMT by means of a search operation using the search tools available.

Please find below (see table 1) a list containing the meetings that took place between ACEA and DG TRADE officials in the period 1 January 2019 – 31 August 2020.

Letters and other forms of written correspondence to and from third parties (e.g. electronic messages) are stored in the Commission's electronic registry – ARES. A search operation performed in ARES resulted in no written correspondence found between DG TRADE and ACEA on the issue of cross-sectoral supply chain due diligence obligations in the period 1 January 2019 – 31 August 2020. Therefore, the Commission has concluded that there are no documents corresponding to the second part of your request.

As specified in Article 2(3) of Regulation (EC) No 1049/2001, the right of access as defined in that regulation applies only to existing documents in the possession of the institution.

Given that no such documents, corresponding to the description given in your application, are held by the Commission, the Commission is not in a position to fulfil the second part of your request.
