Dear Sir,

We refer to your e-mail dated 8/10/2013 in which you make a request for access to documents, registered under the above-mentioned reference number.

Your application concerns the following document/documents:

1) The documents DG JUSTICE drew up as contractual correspondence about the three grant agreements JUST/2012/PROG/AG/3720, JUST/2009/FRAC/AG/1279 and JUST/2011/PROG/AG/1909.

The documents identified by the Commission as relevant under this point of your enquiry are as follows:

- a) for JUST/2012/PROG/AG/3720:

Having examined the documents requested under point 1 of your request under the provisions of Regulation (EC) No 1049/2001 regarding public access to documents, I have come to the conclusion that they may be partially disclosed. Some parts of the

documents have been blanked out as their disclosure is prevented by exceptions to the right of access laid down in Article 4 of this Regulation.

The expunged parts of documents requested under point 1 are:

- The names and signatures of the members of the staff of the European Commission and the Danish Institute for Human Rights and other individuals involved in the projects concerned by your request, as well as their personal telephone numbers and electronic contact details;
- The bank details of the Danish Institute for Human Rights.

Disclosure of these parts would undermine the protection of

privacy and the integrity of the individual

Please note that pursuant to Article 4(1) (b) of Regulation (EC) No 1049/2001, access to a document has to be refused if its disclosure would undermine the protection of privacy and the integrity of the individual, in particular in accordance with EU legislation regarding the protection of personal data. The applicable legislation in this field is Regulation (EC) No 45/2001 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 18 December 2000 on the protection of individuals with regard to the processing of personal data by the Community institutions and bodies and on the free movement of such data ¹.

When access is requested to documents containing personal data, Regulation (EC) No 45/2001 becomes fully applicable². According to Article 8(b) of this Regulation, personal data shall only be transferred to recipients if they establish the necessity of having the transferred them and if there data to reason to assume that the legitimate rights of the persons concerned might be prejudiced. We consider that, with the information available, the necessity of disclosing the aforementioned personal data to you has not been established and that it cannot be assumed that such disclosure would not prejudice the legitimate rights of the persons concerned. Therefore, we are disclosing the documents requested expunged from this personal data.

If you wish to receive these personal data, we invite you to provide us with arguments showing the need for having these personal data transferred to you and the absence of adverse effects to the legitimate rights of the persons whose personal data should be disclosed.

In case you would disagree with the assessment that the expunged data are personal data which can only be disclosed if such disclosure is legitimate under the rules of personal data protection, you are entitled, in accordance with Article 7(2) of Regulation (EC) No 1049/2001, to make a confirmatory application requesting the Commission to review this position.

Publishing financial data (including bank details) of a legal person may harm the commercial interests of the said legal person. Moreover, there is no overriding public interest justifying the disclosure of this information.

2) Evaluation Reports for three grant agreements awarded to DIHR under the calls JUST/2012/PROG/AG, JUST/2009/FRAC/AG and JUST/2011/PROG/AG.

Having examined the documents requested under point 2 of your request under the provisions of Regulation (EC) No 1049/2001 regarding public access to documents, I have come to the conclusion that they may be partially disclosed. Some parts of the documents have been blanked out as their disclosure is prevented by exceptions to the right of access laid down in Article 4 of this Regulation.

The expunged parts of the documents are:

- The names and signatures of the members of the evaluation committee and assessors, including their individual declarations of absence of conflict of interest and of confidentiality;
- The assessment of financial capacity of applicants, except for Danish Institute, and accessorily, any text that would allow identification of applicants with financial capacity assessed as weak.

• privacy and the integrity of the individual:

Please note that pursuant to Article 4(1) (b) of Regulation (EC) No 1049/2001, access to a document has to be refused if its disclosure would undermine the protection of privacy and the integrity of the individual, in particular in accordance with EU legislation regarding the protection of personal data. If you wish to receive these personal data, we invite you to provide us with arguments showing the need for having these personal data transferred to you and the absence of adverse effects to the legitimate rights of the persons whose personal data should be disclosed.

In case you would disagree with the assessment that the expunged data are personal data which can only be disclosed if such disclosure is legitimate under the rules of personal data protection, you are entitled, in accordance with Article 7(2) of Regulation (EC) No 1049/2001, to make a confirmatory application requesting the Commission to review this position.

• commercial interests of a legal person, including intellectual property:

For two applicants, the financial capacity was assessed as weak, and precautionary measures were recommended, without excluding these two applicants. Putting this information in the public domain would affect the applicants' reputation on the market.

Moreover, there is no overriding public interest justifying the disclosure of this information. The financial capacity assessment of Danish Institute, which you may be interested in as the application concerns Danish Institute, has not been expunged.

I have also examined the Evaluation Report in order to determine whether revealing the scores and comments of the evaluators' comments would harm the commercial interests of the applicants. Taking into account the nature of the comments included in this report, as well as the fact that the ranking of the proposals (which is the results of the scores allocated to them) is already public in the relevant award decision, I have decided that the exception on the basis of the "commercial interests, including intellectual property" does not apply in this case.

In accordance with Article 7(2) of Regulation 1049/2001, you are entitled to make a confirmatory application requesting the Commission to review this position.
