Dear Mrs Chapuis,

You might remember that we discussed last year about bioenergy. The legislation is under important discussion again and I think it would be important to exchange views again.

This week, the interservice consultation process began for the review of REDII which will be crucial in enhancing the framework for ensuring the sustainability of renewable energy. Given the number of changes coming in the Fit for 55 package and the impact that such review will have on the bioenergy sector, I would very much appreciate the opportunity for a meeting in the coming weeks at your convenience to discuss the review of the REDII criteria, in particular the sustainability criteria for solid biomass. During our meeting, I would be happy to discuss the different policy proposals on the table and analyse how they could impact bioenergy generation and share the views of the sector on how those proposals could improve the existing system while minimizing the negative impact in the sector's value chain.

If possible, please suggest a few time slots that would be convenient for you so that we may accommodate your schedule and have an opportunity to meet to discuss these changes. For your awareness, a similar request has also been sent to your colleagues at DG Climate Action, DG Agriculture, DG Environment, and DG Trade.
