Discussion and clarification provided:

- Russian citizen may act as a cabin crew on a non-sanctioned EU operator. It would however not be allowed to work for a sanctioned (Russian) operator.
- Russian citizen may receive EU training and undergo EU examination for working for a non-sanctioned operator. If the applicant does not yet have a contract, the situation is not clearly addressed in the law. Licence could be issued, based on assumption that the pilot will not work for a sanctioned (Russian) operator.
- Russian citizen may act as instructor in an EU training organisation (even DTO), as flights are under the control of the EU organisation. In general, activities "under the control" of an EU training organisation are possible for Russian citizen.
- Licence to Russian citizen does not need to be issued with a remark / restriction that the pilot is not allowed to fly in Russia. It could be a separate paper or simply reminding the pilot of the legal consequences of the sanctions.
- PPL training and examination to a Russian citizen might be allowed, if there is proof that the PPL is only an interim step to a CPL (modular training)

Conclusion/decision(s):
