Dear Mr Neujeffski,

I refer to your request for access to European Commission documents registered on 23 November 2022 under the above-mentioned reference number.

You request access to:

1. A list of correspondences and meetings between DG ECFIN and the Polish government regarding the government's 2022 anti-inflation measures, including but not limited to the reduction of the VAT on gas and fertilisers.
2. The correspondence itself between DG ECFIN and the Polish government as identified in the list of correspondences.

I consider your request to cover documents held up to the date of your initial application, i.e., 23 November 2022.

Please note that due to the wide scope of your request, covering also areas falling under the responsibility of other Directorates-General, parts of your request have been attributed to other Directorates-General<sup>1</sup>. This reply relates only to the documents held by Directorate-General for Economic and Financial Affairs. You will receive the replies from the other respective Directorates-General in due course.

The following document falls within the scope of your application:

- “Flash report – PL forecast mission” sent by the desk officers on mission to Isabel Grilo, Director of Directorate G on 19 October 2022, reference Ares(2022)8486651. This report summarises the desk officers' discussions with the Ministry of Finance in the meeting on 18 October 2022 as well as discussions with other stakeholders during the Commission autumn economic forecast mission to Warsaw on 17-18 October 2022.
