Dear All,

I am writing to you to invite you to a virtual conversation between the EU and US on Clean Technologies in the context of REpowerEU.

The meeting follows the Joint [Statement](#) between the Commission and the United States on European Energy Security of 25 March. The Joint Statement committed the two sides to partner on: *“technologies and energy efficiency solutions such as ramping up demand response devices (such as smart thermostats) and heat pump deployment and installations, scaling procurement for clean energy equipment, investing in innovative technologies and fuel-switching away from fossil fuels”*.

The call will take place on 25 April at 17:00h CET by Zoom (link will follow).

The meeting will consist of a single session for Gov-to-Gov and Business. On the Commission side the meeting will be chaired by the Director General for Energy Ditte Juul Jørgensen. For the U.S., the co-chair will be Melanie Nakagawa, special Assistant to the President and NSC Senior Director for Climate and Energy.

In terms of format, we propose 2 representatives per Member State. We are available to provide more details if needed.
