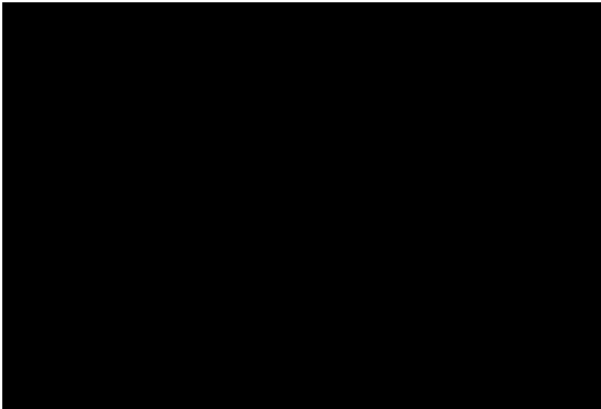
As we discussed a few weeks back -- please find attached an overview of STR litigation and market access requirements for hosts across Europe.

We've drafted these documents to the best of our ability, but neither should be viewed as complete. This is especially the case for market access requirements for hosts, where (as you know) the complex and hyper-local nature of many rules - for example that even vary between city districts in places such as Budapest - makes it very hard to track regulatory developments applicable to hosts in a comprehensive manner.

Dear all,

Following our meeting last week, I wanted to enquire whether you were able to compile some of the information we discussed and in any case, whether you would be able to send us some information before 11 February?

To recap, we are mainly interested in getting a good overview of “market access requirements” imposed on hosts (e.g. registration, authorisation, limit on the number of nights that can be rented out, etc...) in place at national and/or local level in the EU.

We are also trying to get a better overview of litigation happening in the EU, both initiated by public authorities and stakeholders (hosts/platforms/other) on STR rules (which, in the case of platforms, can also be on data sharing requests, etc...).

Finally, should you have some examples of offline intermediaries, and possibly their size/number of actors, that would also be welcome.
