**Subject:** Minutes meeting with Airbnb 22 Feb 2022 - cost of infrastructure

**Meeting minutes – Airbnb on cost of development of technical tools – 22 February 2022**

**Presents:** AIRBNB [REDACTED] GROW - [REDACTED]

**Discussion points:**

- Airbnb presented their estimation of costs linked with the development of IT infrastructure for data sharing with Public Authorities. The costs identified
  - One way API (sending data to public authorities through automated tools) [REDACTED]
  - Two ways API (sending and receiving data to public authorities through automated tools) [REDACTED]
- Airbnb stressed that variations on the costs will be determined especially on additional technical systems due to heterogeneity of implementation between Member States.
- Airbnb stressed the commitment to face the cost for create the right tool for EU, regardless the cost that the solution identified will require.
- Airbnb underlined that the company has a variety of methods to help relevant public authorities to enforce their rules: education programmes, reminders and multichannel follow-ups for hosts.
- Airbnb gave concrete examples of their actual agreements with some local authorities:
  - In Los Angeles, Airbnb developed a two way API system that verify in real time the lawfulness of each listing by questioning the city database;
  - In San Francisco, Airbnb developed a structured data-sharing system based on a dedicated city ordinance;
  - In France, Airbnb (with other platforms) is developing with the national authorities a pilot project for automated data sharing.
- Airbnb mentioned that in some cases data-sharing with public authorities did not translated into use of such data. [REDACTED]
