Dear Members and alternate Members of the Management Board,

We regret to inform you that Mr Jean-Pierre Dintilhac, the Management Board member from France, passed away on 6 March.

Born on 15 March 1943, he had a long and distinguished career working in the judiciary and other areas of public service. He was Director of the French Prison Service (1988-1990), Director of the Cabinet of the Keeper of the Seals (1990-1991) and Director of the National Gendarmerie (1991-1994). He became Advocate-General at the Court of Cassation before becoming, in 1998, State Prosecutor at the Grand Instance Court of Paris. After being nominated trial judge at the Court of Cassation in 2002, he was assigned to the Second Civil Division that he presided from July 2004 to April 2006. From there he became Honorary President of Division of the Court of Cassation.

He also was an Officer of the Legion of Honour and Commander of the National Order of Merit.

On this sad occasion, we would like to acknowledge his valuable contribution to and support of the work of FRA's Management Board. We are deeply saddened by this loss. Our thoughts and sincere condolences go out to his family.
