

Mr. Degert,

I am writing to you as a concerned former citizen of Serbia. As the Head for the European delegation to Serbia I am seeking to make you aware of significant and serious allegations against Serbian authorities by its own citizens, with respect to baby traficing. Early in 2005, hundreds of Serbian parents made claims to the Serbian government that the children they were told died at birth were in fact alive. From the period of 1970-2000, it is believed that upwards to 10,000 children, that reportedly died during or shortly after childbirth in various Hospitals throughout Serbia.



Mr.Degert I am sure you are well aware of the current Stolen Babies scandal in Spain, where hundreds of thousands of babies were taken from their parents and given/sold to other families funneled through the Catholic church. Spanish authorities have not denied or suppressed the truth, but instead has allowed its citizens to investigate and seek out justice in the hopes of finding their lost loved ones. In Serbia, we want the government to do the same, accept responsibility to its citizens.

President Tadic had declared 2012 as the "Battle for Babies" in Serbia, in response to Serbia's need for better/improved equipment for children born premature and in need of specialized care. All the parents of missing babies in Serbia want is for their own "Baby Battle" to be recognized
