Dear Mr Prats Monne,

It was good to meet you Monday at the "50 year anniversary" event. I and many other participants appreciated your comments on AMR, antimicrobial resistance. I have been personally involved in this field for many years, and EFPIA has supported the Commission on your Action Plan, such as a through a strong commitment in IMI.

However, we still lack a global scheme for preservation **and** affordable and equitable access. And we need new incentives, decoupling revenues from sales. There is also a need for separate development tracks for the development of new antibiotics for either human use or for animals. I would like to present concrete proposals on these three points.

Recognising that DG SANTE will attend important policy discussions later this month, and that The Netherlands will prioritise AMR during their Council Presidency, I hope we can find some time in the coming weeks.

I can suggest October 15, 20 or 21 (morning).
