Your request has been treated pursuant to the provisions of Regulation No 1049/2001 regarding public access to European Parliament, Council and Commission documents, which also applies to EASO documents, and in accordance with Decision No 6 laying down practical arrangements regarding public access to the documents of EASO, as adopted by its Management Board on 20 September 2011.

We regret to inform you that, although EASO offers support to Greece in the implementation of the EU-Turkey Statement, EASO does not have any documents pertaining to the UNHCR criteria for resettlement from Turkey, which your request seems to refer to.
