Mr Ristori asked me to reply to your e-mail of 7 February on IAP and the Italy Albania submarine cable.

Concerning the submarine cable Italy-Albania, the project received the status of "Project of Energy

Community Interest-PECI" for the first PECI list which was adopted in 2014; however the PECI status has

not been renewed for this project when the second list was adopted in 2016. Therefore the Commission

cannot comment on the costs of the projects, nor on details such as routing options. For more

On the other hand a Project of Common Interest (PCI), the "Interconnector Italy-Montenegro", aims to

Honorable Mr. Sefcovic,

Congratulations for your new position and I hope that your presence in this position will be a new opportunity for a better and safer EU's natural gas' market.

I would be very much appreciated if you would have a look to the attached report. I had forwarded this report on November 2<sup>nd</sup> 2010, to the prior Commissioner for Energy Mr. Günther Oettinger.

The reason that I did it was because I had predicted that the proposed gas pipelines ITGI, Nabucco and South Stream was impossible to be a reality. Thus I had proposed a FSRU LNG Concept which was more realistic. Furthermore I had discussed this concept with the diplomacy of Qatar and they were interested. Please mention that Qataris interest was before Fucushima's nuclear disaster.

On March 24<sup>th</sup> 2011, I received an e-mail from Mr. 1 Directorate-General for Energy, Unit B.1 Security of Supply and Networks. Mr. anvited me to Brussels to discuss the concept in depth.

Immediately I informed Greek Government's Energy Authorities and I asked support. But due different strategy or due any other reason, I didn't receive any support. Finally I informed Mr. that without government support it was difficult to go on.

My last contact with a European Commission's official about this concept was with Mr.

Adviser of Task Force Greece, here in Athens on January 27<sup>th</sup> 2012.

Maybe the status is a little different today than the situation is described to the attached report, but what has sense is that if you will read Mr. Günther Oettinger's interview in the following link, you will find out that I had proposed the same idea in 2010.

On March 2013, I forwarded an official petition to European Union's Leadership that you could read in the following link of Euractiv:

The reason that I did it was because I was sure that DESFA's privatization was a mistake according the way that happened and this procedure would be a risk for EU's gas market security of supply. Furthermore I'm afraid that SOCAR has connected DESFA's acquisition with TAP pipeline construction.

It's obvious that your mission is very difficult and European Commission has to choose carefully what is risky less. The dependency from Russia or the dependency from Russia and Turkey? This is a critical decision you have to receive and in case you need any assistance to this, please be informed that I'm interested to work with your team. My long term experience as the prior representative of POYRY GROUP is connected with South Gas Corridor and it would be a big honor for me if I would present you an alternative.
