In your initial application of 2 November 2018, addressed to the Directorate-General for International Cooperation and Development, you requested access to:

- 'a list of all meetings held by DG FISMA with representatives of Philips since 1 January 2011, relating to (possible) EU-investments in Africa such as the development of the External Investment Plan and Trust Funds;
