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


#### **FISHERIES**

#### Fishing opportunities 2020

After lengthy negotiations, Council managed to find a unanimous agreement on the proposal setting out the fishing opportunities for 2020 in the Atlantic and North Sea, based on a Commission proposal in line with scientific advice and the CFP principles. This meeting was a particularly challenging one due to mainly two factors. First, the MSY (maximum sustainable yield) deadline of 2020 and second, the worrying situation of cod in the Celtic Sea.

The latter issue could notably be solved by setting a TAC level aiming at avoiding premature closure of the fishery in early 2020 and, at the same time, also avoiding potential discarding, which could undermine data collection and scientific assessment of the stock. In addition, further remedial measures have been introduced in order to improve selectivity by making the usage of gears that have lower levels of by-catches of cod mandatory in the areas where cod catches are significant, thus decreasing the fishing mortality of this stock in mixed fisheries.

Political agreement

**The Presidency** recalled the discussions that had already taken place in Coreper and reiterated that the political agreement should be in line with the objectives of the common fisheries policy (CFP) and scientific advice.

Commissioner Sinkevičius reiterated the strong commitment to meet the objectives of the common fisheries policy – setting the total allowable catches (TACs) at the level of maximum sustainable yield (MSY) and taking remedial measures to return struggling stocks (cod in the Celtic Sea in particular) back to health.

Most Member States welcomed what they deemed to be a balanced Commission proposal and shared the objective of achieving MSY in 2020. At the same time several called for using the flexibility granted by the multiannual plans to take socioeconomic considerations into account (ES, PT, FR, UK) and avoid choke situations (DE, DK, ES, FR, IE, UK). The introduction of control and technical measures into the regulation was a contentious point for FR, BE, DE, ES, IT, PT, LT. The Ministers of NL, DE, LT and IT spoke against the introduction of CCTV as an additional control measure. On the contrary, SE and DK welcomed the use of CCTV as the best and most effective way of monitoring, albeit both stressed the need for a gradual roll-out. The TAC level for cod in the Celtic Sea mixed fisheries was a pressure point for ES, FR, IE, and UK in particular.

On the second day of the Council, the Presidency, in agreement with the Commission,

proposed the compromise set out below, which was endorsed unanimously by Ministers. The political agreement for the first time includes a comprehensive package of technical measures into the Regulation, to avoid unwanted bycatches and thus stimulate the regeneration of the cod stocks in the Celtic Sea. Increase of mesh sizes, extension of protection zones and the monitoring measures introduced will improve selectivity and sustainability of fishing activities in the Celtic Sea and the Kattegat. Given the collapse of cod in the Celtic Sea, a TAC of 800 t. was set for unavoidable bycatch (while the Commission had proposed 189 t. in line with scientific advice), paired with the above-mentioned strong selectivity measures. The Commission issued a statement acknowledging Council's efforts to protect cod in the Celtic Sea through increased selectivity measures, but regretted that the respective TAC had not been set at a more cautious level to allow for a more rapid recovery of the stock.
