Dear Ms. Roxburgh,

I refer to your email dated 6 October 2020, registered on 9 October, in which you make a request for access to documents, under the above mentioned reference number.

Your request concerns: 'All documentation (including but not limited to all email correspondence, attendance lists, agendas, background papers, transcripts, recordings and minutes/notes) relating to the meeting listed below: Between Camilla Bursi, Cabinet member of Virginijus Sinkevičius and Virginijus Sinkevičius, Commissioner on 20th May 2020'.

Four documents have been identified in the scope of your request:

- 1. Eurelectric letter of 4 December 2019 requesting a meeting, sent by a mail of the following day document Ares (2019) 7543037;
- 2. Reply from the Cabinet of 25 February 2020 document Ares(2020) 1183773;
- 3. Correspondence to re-arrange the physical meeting into a virtual one, due to the Covid document Ares (2020)5998698;
- 4. The meeting report drafted document Ares (2020)5999508.

With regard to these documents, a complete disclosure is prevented by the exception concerning the protection of privacy and the integrity of the individual outlined in Article 4(1)(b) of Regulation (EC) No 1049/2001, because they contain the following personal data:

- the names/initials and contact details of natural persons;
- handwritten signature.

Article 9(1)(b) of the Data Protection Regulation does not allow the transmission of these personal data, except if you prove that it is necessary to have the data transmitted to you for a specific purpose in the public interest and where there is no reason to assume that the legitimate interests of the data subject might be prejudiced. In your request, you do not express any particular interest to have access to these personal data nor do you put forward arguments to establish the necessity to have the data transmitted for a specific purpose in the public interest. Consequently, I conclude that, pursuant to Article 4(1)(b) of Regulation (EC) No 1049/2001, access cannot be granted to the personal data contained in the requested documents, as the need to obtain access thereto for a purpose in the public interest has not been substantiated and there is no reason to think that the legitimate interests of the individuals concerned would not be prejudiced by disclosure of the personal data concerned.

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In case you would disagree with this position, you are entitled, in accordance with Article 7(2) of Regulation (EC) No 1049/2001, to submit a confirmatory application requesting the Commission to review this position.
