Dear Luigi,

Thank you for the submission of the Italian recovery and resilience plan.

In line with Article 25(1) of the RRF Regulation, the Commission is under an obligation to transmit Italian officially submitted recovery and resilience plan to the European Parliament and the Council without undue delay. In accordance with Article 25(3) of the RRF Regulation, Italy may request the Commission to redact sensitive or confidential information, the disclosure of which would jeopardize public interests of Italy. Such redacted information will still be disclosed to the European Parliament and the Council, but be done so in a confidential manner in accordance with the applicable rules.

In line with the obligation on the Commission to transmit without an undue delay, the Commission intends to transmit the Italy recovery and resilience plan to the European Parliament and Council in the course of tomorrow (4 May). As you are aware from the RRF negotiations, the European Parliament placed a high premium on the transparency of the recovery and resilience plans and the Commission intends to take an approach of open transparency in line with the legal obligations. In the transmission email/letter, Italy has not requested the Commission to redact sensitive or confidential information. We therefore intend to transmit the Italian plan to the European Parliament and the Council in full, unless you indicate to the Commission the need to redact sensitive or confidential information by **midday on 4th May**, indicating the elements that should be redacted and justifying the jeopardy that its release would cause to the public interests of Italy. As mentioned above, we would like to recall that any redacted information will be provided to the European Parliament and Council anyway, only in a confidential manner.
