Thank you very much for your email.

Indeed, this is a recurrent issue in several regions in different countries.

In order to assure timely updates from our end, it was decided to categorise as "no data available" the regions for which data was not available at the time of ECDC data collection or for which the retro correction of cases applied lead to a negative value in a specific region. In these cases we always give an explanation as a disclaimer, as it can be seen in our webpage.

There is no feasible alternative that would allow us to have a harmonised approach for all countries when dealing with the recurrent retro corrections and the lack of publicly available historic data at regional level for some of the EU/EEA countries.

We will try to contact you in the future if we experience this limitation for any of the Spanish regions, so that we can try to amend our data on time.

Please do not hesitate to come back to us should you have further questions.



The source we use to produce these maps is the EI data, which in the particular case of Spain is taken from the reports released by the Ministry of Health.

The issue we had is that compared to previous weeks, fewer cumulative cases were reported in La Rioja during week 10. This is due to the elimination of duplicate cases from all the historic series. Therefore, case notification rates for week 2021-10 were not representative of the current situation and the maps show "rate not calculated" for La Rioja. This situation will be reverted in the new maps produced this week, when the 14-day notification rate will be possible to be calculated again.

I hope this clarifies.
