## COMPROMISE AMENDMENTS

### Foreign policy consequences of the COVID-19 outbreak.

#### **COMP 1 (AMs 75,76,77,78, 83, 107)**

1. Affirms that the global outbreak of the COVID-19 pandemic is a game changer in the international environment, **a risk multiplier (78,)** and a catalyst of change in the global order; **stresses the fundamental importance of strengthening the EU internal resilience (76) and to develop new partnerships (75) and strengthen its multilateralist vision (76, 77) on a global scale, with an assertive and coordinated foreign policy response (83, 107);**

#### **COMP 2 (AMs 81, 86, 107, 125, 503)**

1a new. **Welcomes the Team Europe and Coronavirus Global Response support initiatives to help partner countries to tackle the impact of the coronavirus on cross-border coordination (125, 503) and welcomes the EU coordination with the G7,G20, UN, WHO and the World Food Programme (81) and other international partners in order to foster a coherent and inclusive global response to the pandemic (86, 107); to mitigate the wider impact on societies and economies and to help reducing the risk of destabilisation (AM 86);**

#### **COMP 3 (AMs 91, 92, 93, 96, 100, 125)**

2. Regrets the lack of global leadership and coordinated international response in the initial phases of the COVID-19 crisis **condemns withholding of critical information (Greens), rejects the pursuit of (93) isolationist solutions, strongly objects to (93) the rise of authoritarian nationalism, state-sponsored disinformation campaigns and the promotion of false narratives which create distrust and undermines democratic societies and (96) international cooperation or raise questions around the role of the EU in the world (92); underlines that global cooperation, an inclusive global approach (125) and coordination are essential to effectively tackle the global health crisis and other global threats (91, 100);**

#### **COMP 4 (2a new, 2b new) (102,103, 105, 104, 106, 110, 119, 117, 123, 82, 126, 127, 129, 130, 530, 548, 549, 561, 562)**

2a new. **Deplores the fact that a number of governments and political leaders across the globe (119) is using the crisis as an opportunity to furnish themselves with excessive powers (102), pursue their own political agendas by limiting human rights, undermining democratic standards, weakening the rule of law, diminishing the role of parliaments, limiting freedom of media, inciting hatred campaigns against minority groups (110) launching disinformation campaigns that target pro-EU reforms and values and harming international cooperation (104,105), insists that any state of emergency must contain a termination clause (SD 549) is concerned that rallies protesting against coronavirus restrictions which are taking place in various cities around the world are often infiltrated and manipulated by extremist groups (Greens) with demonstrators calling the virus a hoax (103);**

2b new. **Deplores that the consequences of the COVID-19 pandemic have exacerbated global socio-economic inequalities (117) and disproportionately affect the poorest and persons in the most disadvantaged, marginalised and unprotected social categories including migrants (SD) (123, 126, 127); condemns all forms of exclusion and discrimination against those infected with COVID-19 (129) and calls on the third countries and the EU Member States to mitigate the social effects of the pandemic (82,126,123,);**

**COMP 5 (AMs 112, 113, 114, 121, 134)**

3. Calls on the Vice-President of the Commission / High Representative of the Union for Foreign Affairs and Security Policy (VP/HR) to review the 2016 Global Strategy, **in light of the global impact of the crisis**, reflecting these geopolitical shifts , **to ensure (112) more strategic EU action and (113) ensure** that the EU plays its part in defending **promoting and developing (114)** the rules-based multilateral world order that was created **since** the Second World War, **and to include democracy support and protection of human rights as a Team Europe priority, involving the European Parliament in this task through its existing democracy and rule of law (SD) support tools and mechanisms ( 112, 121);**

**COMP 6 (AMs 133, 135, 139, 140, 141, 143, , 145 353)**

4. Notes **with concern that (133)** the geopolitical competition and tensions **accelerated (140, 145)** following the COVID-19 outbreak, and recognises that the European Union still has to position itself in this new **geopolitical environment (143); agrees that the post COVID-19 world will look fundamentally different and will have far reaching consequences for EU external policy (135) and believes that COVID-19 has confirmed the need for a stronger and more effective EU foreign and security policy (353);**

**COMP 7 (AMs 132, 146, 149, 150, 151, 152, , 155, 300, ,357, 457, 472)**

**4a new. Considers that in this changing context, the EU must step up and lead by example (151) championing multilateral solutions (149) , working with international organisations, notably the UN and its agencies, WHO, World Bank, IMF and international regional organisations, like NATO (150, 152), seeking stronger cooperation with like-minded , countries including from the southern hemisphere (Greens, 457), (132) promoting collaboration between democratic regimes (146) and strengthening democratic values (146) (); reminds that the pandemic has emphasised the need to work together to find common solutions to problems that concern all of humankind (150);**

**COMP 8 (AMs , 170, 167, 164, 166, 168, 169, 171, 172, 173, 174, 175, 177, 200, 204, 214)**

5. Is concerned about **the lack of cooperation by the United States Government (171) , its reluctance to take a leading role (173) in response to the (174) COVID-19 and the lack of participation in joint initiatives on vaccines (164, 168);** believes that the **alternative facts and (170) false information, denying the severity of the pandemic (169)** have been very **misleading (SD)**in the joint fight against the virus; **calls on both the EU and the US to strengthen cooperation and solidarity on the basis of a science-oriented approach (172) in the common fight**





against the **COVID-19 pandemic, including timely exchange of information (177), research and development of the vaccine and the strategic medical equipment (166, 175, 200), as well as to tackle other global challenges together (204,);**

**COMP 9 (5a new) (, 155, 176, 177, 178, 200)**

5a new. **Reminds that transatlantic cooperation remains an essential pillar of EU foreign policy (200) and paramount for mutual security and trade interests of the EU and the US (178), expresses continued support for the transatlantic alliance and closer strategic transatlantic cooperation (155), regrets unilateral measures (SD) taken during the COVID-19 crises (177) such as travel restrictions from the EU Schengen area to the United States without previous consultations with the EU (176);**

**COMP 10 (181, 182, 186, 187, 188, 191, 192, 195, 196, 197)**

6. **Regrets (,195) the decline of US engagement globally (187) and the decision of the US Government (192) to withdraw funding from the World Health Organization (WHO), Open Skies Treaty (181) and the general tendency of the current US administration to stand aloof 186) from multiple (197) multilateral organisations that were created to establish a rules-based liberal (188) world order, or undermine them (ICC) (191, 182);**

**COMP 11 (AMs 155, 201, 202, 203, 204, 205, 206, 207, 208, 210, , 212, 213, 215)**

7. **Stresses the need to consolidate and enhance (206, 208, 210,) cooperation between the EU and the US (), based on mutual respect and a joint agenda to defend multilateralism, international law (207), shared democratic values (205, 211) the rule of law and human rights; notes that, in a world marked by great power competition (202), the European Union and the United States share common values linked to the existing international structures (203) and remain indispensable partners in the current volatile international environment (215);**

**COMP 12 (AMs 222, 223, 224, 225, 226, 227, 228, , 247, , 301, 349, 270, 273, 274, 280, 281, 283, 284)**

8. Notes the strengthening of the People's Republic of China's **assertive public diplomacy (227) worldwide following the COVID-19 outbreak, seeking to fill the political vacuum in the multilateral system left by a more isolationist USA and trying to (226) position itself as the dominant global player with an alternative governance model (228); is concerned about the PRC's efforts of stronger power projection in the region resulting in border disputes with many of its neighbours (Greens) (224) and promotion of the national strategic interests through multilateral organizations (222, 301) is concerned about the possible shift of power in global politics related to change of China's leadership (225); objects that the Chinese government used the momentum of the pandemic outbreak to impose the national security law and (283) crackdown on the pro-democracy movement in Hong Kong, and has threatened to annex to increase the threats against Taiwan (280) and to increase its activities in Tibet and the South China Sea, as well as the brutal persecution of Uighurs in Xinjiang (270, 273, 274, 281 284) and condemns the repeated attacks and pressure by Chinese representatives on Members states governments and democratically elected politicians in the EU, such as the Czech Senate President and Sweden's Minister for Culture (223, 247);**

**COMP 14 (AMs 235, 236, 238, 239, 240, 241, 242, 244, 254, 258, 260, 268, 270, 272 )**

9. **Notes that after the breakout of Covid-19 China provided** emergency contributions to fight the virus **and regrets that some were faulty or of inferior quality (235,);** also recognises, however, **geopolitically and geo-economically motivated efforts (244)** bolstered by ‘virus and wolf warrior diplomacy’ **disinformation campaigns and aggressive propaganda (239, 241, 254, 258, 260) condemns the attempts by China to use this "virus diplomacy" against the EU (236) with the ambition to shape its global image as a benevolent power (240, 244) regrets China’s isolation of Taiwan in the WHO (238);** calls on the Member States to advocate Taiwan’s membership **as an observer in the WHO/WHA and other international organisations (270) considering its effective handling of the virus domestically without being able to contribute with its expertise to the international response to the current health crisis (268); and praises the aid provided by the Taiwanese authorities (238);**

**COMP 15 (AMs 230, 231, 234, 246,248, 249, 250, 251, 252, 253, 268, 269, 275, 277)**

10. Is concerned about **some mistakes and** lack of transparency related to the **initial (253) Chinese reaction to the global outbreak, of the COVID-19 pandemic (253),** involving to **cover-up the magnitude of the problem (230), the attempts to manipulate (249) and** withhold information, **poor communication with the World Health Organisation (251) censorship, the suppression, threatening, persecution and forced disappearance (252) of whistle-blowers and human rights activists and citizen journalists (231) creating doubts about the official death toll of Covid-19 victims (250), all of which had a damaging impact on the EU’s ability to foresee, prepare for, and face the COVID-19 crisis and has cost lives; (248), therefore** urges the Chinese **government (268) to fully cooperate with an independent international (275) investigation into the origins of COVID-19, and calls on the Member States to develop a comprehensive approach (277) towards a rising China and protect the EU’s strategic autonomy (269),**

**COMP 16 (AMs 262, 264, 256, 265, 291, 436, 555, 563)**

11. Is concerned about the potential ‘debt trap’ that might affect African countries as a result of COVID-19 **as well as increasing political and economic dependencies of third countries from China (264, 256),** since the economic downturn will make it difficult for them to reimburse Chinese loans that are part of the Belt and Road Initiative; **urges the EU and its Member States to promote the search for viable solutions regarding debt relief for third countries within international fora (262, 265, 555, 563); calls on the EU and its member states to ensure that humanitarian exemptions from sanctions have an immediate and practical effect in terms of swift delivery of medical equipment, supplies and other forms of assistance to the countries affected (436);**

**COMP 18 (AMs 286, 288, 289, 290, 292, 293, 294, 295, 301)**

13. Calls on the VP/HR to recognise these concerns, **review EU-China relations (294) and simultaneously create an atmosphere of dialogue, engagement and genuine cooperation and competition (greens) based on a new, coherent (288), more assertive adopted to the changed geopolitical and geo-economic landscape (290) long-term (292) strategy towards China (289) in which the EU and the Member states cooperate where possible, compete where needed, confront where (293) pushes back when necessary to defend European values and interests (286);** is of the view that, as part of this new strategy, the EU should seek closer collaboration with **like-minded** countries in the region and other democracies **including India, Australia, New Zealand, Japan and South Korea and work towards a**

**European strategy (RE) of the Indo-Pacific (286, 290, 295) for which the EU connectivity strategy should be used to the fullest (288).**

**COMP 19 (AMs 148, 310, 311, 312, 314, 315, 316, 317, 318, 323 327, 344)**

14. Expresses **utmost (317)** concern over the structural **systematic (312)** attempts of the Russian Federation to undermine EU unity **and its crisis response (318)**, **create mistrust between the EU and Western Balkans and Eastern Partnership countries (310, 314)** by the intensification of disinformation campaigns **since the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic (148) and cyberattacks against research organisations as well as the politicisation of humanitarian assistance (312, 316, 327)**; **commends the European External Action Service and the StratCom East department on their efforts to identify and suppress disinformation campaigns of Russian related media outlets in several Member States (311, 344) and calls on the Commission to increase its efforts and funding dedicated to combatting Russian fake news (323)**;

**COMP 20 (14a new, 14b new, 14c new) (AMs 305, 319, 320, 321, 322, 324, 325, 326, 328, 329, 330, 349)**

14a new. **Recognizes the clear geopolitical and geo-economic dimension of what was offered by Russia, bolstered by “virus diplomacy”, a battle of narratives (330, 324), notes with concern that Russia, is taking some assertive steps in the international arena, with the aim to promote its own geopolitical agenda (320, 349); calls for the EU not to dismiss this and to keep on the agenda the conflicts where Russia has an interest like Belarus, Ukraine, Georgia, Crimea, Syria and Libya (319, 320, 324)**;

14b new. **Expresses deep concern about Russian attempts to use the pandemic to further diminish the human rights space in the country, support authoritarian regimes and continue its aggressive foreign policy (325), highlights that we must not allow countries like Russia to use the crisis to distract from their own significant domestic problems (330); is concerned about the Constitutional Referendum, in which the Russian President used the current crisis to enact crucial constitutional amendments that prolong and bolster his authoritarian rule in Russia; (305, 322, 326)**;

14c new. **Calls on Russia to meaningfully contribute to a global response to the crisis, in good faith and as part of the international rules-based order (328), is concerned about the effectiveness and safety of the new Russian vaccine now in use (329, 321); recalls that the quality of medical products delivered by Russia in some cases was very low and hence ineffective (330)**;

**COMP 22 (AMs 346, 347, 349 350)**

15. Recognises the global security, socio-economic, **environmental (346)** and political risks that could be caused by the consequences of the COVID-19 pandemic, and is worried about the fact that global powers such as **China and Russia (350, 349, 347)** prepared to **skilfully (347)** use the crisis to unravel the rules-based world order underpinned by multilateral organisations;

**COMP 24 (16, 16a new) (AMs 353, 354, 355, 360, 361, 362, 364, 365, 366, , 368, 369, 373, 374, 392, 410, 412, 463, 506)**

16. Stresses that the multilateral rules-based world order is vital for global peace, the rule of law and democracy; believes that a geopolitical EU **together with like-minded partners (361)**, must play a firmer role in defending **and rebuilding (366)** it, **believes that the EU must (361)** and seek ways to de-escalate tensions between powers; , **notably when those tensions hinder multilateral action; notes that the COVID-19 crisis has shown both the need to strengthen multilateral cooperation, notably in global health governance, and the need to reform international institutions ; calls on the EU Member States and the HR/VP to draft the “EU road map on multilateralism” (362) to promote and initiate structural reforms of multilateral organizations (361, 360);**

16a new. **Notes that EU geopolitical ambitions need to be underpinned by adequate budgetary allocations through the upcoming MFF (355, 463) and regrets that the European Council proposed cuts to the budget lines for external policy instruments (392); calls for the EU's budget for external action in the MFF 2021-2027 to be strengthened and sufficient so that the EU has the necessary resources to address the challenges in its neighbourhood, the geopolitical consequences of COVID-19 and can live up to its ambition to become a responsible geopolitical actor (368);**

**COMP 25 (AMs 379, 389, 385, 386, 391, 388, 380, 581)**

17. Stresses that only a **strong and (389)** more united EU **disposing with open strategic autonomy and (386,391)** backed up by sufficient and credible military capacities, **as well as tools and mechanisms to support partners (385)** will be able to **play a strong role in the new geopolitical environment (389)**; conduct a strong foreign policy, and believes that **member states should give (388)** the VP/HR a stronger, **well defined (379)** mandate in speaking on behalf of the EU; **for example by establishing a European seat in multilateral organs; (380), welcomes President Charles Michel's conclusion that ‘it is of utmost importance to increase the strategic autonomy of the Union’ (581);**

**COMP 26 (AMs 400, 401, 402, 403, 405, 407)**

18. Believes that the end of the unanimity rule on **certain** foreign policy **areas (407)** would help the EU to conduct a foreign policy that is more effective, and more proactive **and better suited to respond swiftly to emergencies (400)**; **calls on the Council or European Council to follow the European Commission and European Parliaments' call to move to qualified majority voting, at least on human rights or sanctions implementation, by activating the passerelle clause (402,405); stresses that the EU's leverage is the greatest when member states act together in unionism (403);**

**COMP 27 (19, 19a new, 19b new) (AMs 84, 309, 415, 416, 418, 419, 424, 426, 427, 428, 430, 431, 432, 433, 434, 435, 437, 439, 440, 473)**

19. Underlines the important role of the armed forces during the COVID-19 pandemic **welcomes military assistance to civil support operations, notably for the deployment of field hospitals, patient transport, equipment delivery and distribution (415)** and believes that a more in-depth joint operation and coordination of member states' armed forces within existing frameworks - such as **PESCO project (431)** the European Medical Command - or within new

frameworks - such as military hospital trains - could lead to greater efficiency and contribute to the EU's preparedness to fight pandemics; recognises the need **for military personnel to be sufficiently trained**, prepared and **equipped to deal with this kind of essential tasks in support of their fellow citizens (418)**;

19a new. **Recognises the need to review the EU's security and defence strategies to develop strategic autonomy, including in the health sector (428, 473), to become better prepared and more resilient to the new and hybrid threats and technologies that have made the nature of warfare less conventional and challenge the traditional role of the military, as well as, for a future in which Russia and China are becoming more assertive (432); underlines the need for military mobility to be strengthened in order to help Member States to act faster and more effectively in the context of a future possible conflict (419); stresses that the future Strategic Compass on security and defence should reflect these developments and take account the broader geopolitical implications of COVID-19 (424) and address the full spectrum of threats such as a new pandemic, CBRN, foreign interference, including disinformation or cyber-attacks (433); believes that, given the new political balance and a potential worsening of the international security environment following COVID-19, the EU defence budgets in general, and the military mobility budget in particular (426) must not be cut (434)**;

19b new. **Supports the need for continuing and strengthening cooperation and where needed coordination between the EU and NATO, including the Euro-Atlantic Disaster Response Coordination Centre (EADRCC) or NATO's Centre for Excellence for Military Medicine as well as to counter COVID-19 related disinformation (439, 437, 435) and cyberattacks (440) calls for strong coordination with and support from the European Union Agency for Cybersecurity (ENISA) (440) and on cooperation on the planning and development of military capabilities (416)**;

**COMP 28 (AMs 153, 444, 445, 448, 449, 450, 452, 453, 454, 455, 456, 458, 460, 461, 504)**

20. **Calls for a new institutional approach to strategic communication in order to tackle the challenges and risks facing Western liberal democracies as well as (450) for the expansion and modernisation of EU communication strategies so that EU values and actions are (444) sufficiently visible both within and beyond the EU especially in neighbouring areas (454); urges the European External Action Service (EEAS) to further strengthen its capacities to counter malicious foreign interference and (453, 455) disinformation, hybrid warfare, propaganda and espionage (448) including the creation of dedicated StratCom Task Forces focused on the activities emanating from a) China, and b) the Middle East including Iran (448), and imposing costs on countries and non-state actors (456) that deliberately spread disinformation to divide and harm the EU and its Member States; reaffirms its dedication to developing legislative and non-legislative coordinated framework and improving coordination efforts and information sharing among the Member States at EU level to counteract disinformation (444,445)**;

**Welcomes the work of EUvsDisinfo and the role played by civil society, grassroots organisations, independent journalists and media organisations (504) on the fight against disinformation (460); underlines the importance of a principled EU stance on fighting disinformation linked to the spread of the COVID-19 virus and cyber-attacks against crucial infrastructure; calls on social media platforms to act actively and adopt measures that prevent the spread of disinformation and hate speech regarding the COVID-19 virus (458) and the need to invest into the fight against cyber-crimes and to raise awareness of this increasing threat (461)**;

**COMP 29 (AMs 464, 466, 467, 470)**

21. Stresses that its biggest global consumer market of almost 500 million people gives the EU **significant (466)** leverage on the world stage, and believes that a geopolitical Commission should use this leverage **including through its trade policy (464) to defend EU interests (467)**, when other countries are not prepared to comply with **human rights (470)**, the rule of law or international treaties;

**COMP 30 (AMs 101, 147, 474, 476, 478, 479, 480, 481, 482, 483, 485, 486, 487),**

22. Notes that the COVID-19 pandemic has shown the need to reduce the **EU's (482)** dependency on third countries in certain strategic and existential sectors **such as health (480)** and **strongly supports the (478)** diversification **and relocation (483)** of its most critical supply chains; **points out that COVID-19 has shown the vulnerabilities of interconnectedness and interdependence (485) and led to growing protectionism, therefore underlines the importance of finding the right balance between improving the resilience of our value chains to achieve strategic autonomy, strengthening the EU's global competitiveness (487) and maintaining trade relations as open as possible (474);**

**COMP 31 (AMs 493, 494, 495, 496, 497, 500)**

23. Recalls its **urgent (494)**, request for a strong global sanctions regime to address serious human rights violations **before the end of 2020 (500)**, which would be the EU equivalent of the so-called Magnitsky Act; **which should include acts of high-level corruption as criteria for sanctions; (497, 495) welcomes the announcement by President von der Leyen that the Commission will soon come forward with a proposal (496) and calls on the European Council to adopt the global EU human rights sanctions mechanism as a Decision relating to the Union's strategic interests and objectives under Article 22(1) of the Treaty of the European Union (494);**

**COMP 32 (AMs 118, 120, 151, 352, 351, 356, 372, 459, 501)**

23a new. **Is convinced that a human rights-based response to the COVID-19 pandemic constitutes the most effective, inclusive and sustainable approach to manage the current crisis (352, 120), (351); recalls that third countries' response to the COVID-19 crisis must not violate human rights or international law be limited to strictly necessary, proportionate measures, and subject to regular scrutiny and time bound (372); calls on EU delegations to closely monitor the global human rights situation, identify trends and support international, regional and local organisations, citizens and civil society in their efforts to reverse the negative impact of the COVID 19 crisis on human rights worldwide (501) and calls on the Commission to ensure that the consequences of COVID-19 do not undermine the implementation of the EU values and commitments on human rights already established in the EU Action Plan on Human Rights and Democracy 2020-2024 (118);**

**COMP 33 (24 and 24a new) (AMs 509, 510, (512, 513, 514, 515, 516, 517, 518, 520, 521, 522, 523, 524, 529, 532, 533, 534)**

24. Underlines the strategic importance of EU engagement **leadership (524)** and support in its neighbourhood, both in the East and in the South and **in the Arctic region (520) by helping its neighbours in their combat against the COVID-19 pandemic (516); and calls for increased support for democracy, rule of law, and human rights and reforms in the neighbourhood (510, 514)**

24a new. Stresses that the EU must give Western Balkan countries that are not yet part of the EU a fair chance to join the EU and that the EU must ~~continue~~ **consolidate (523)** its efforts to invest in the region; **stresses that the EU enlargement process and EU's focus on supporting the reform processes in the Western Balkans is continuing despite the ongoing pandemic (529); commends the financial assistance initiative of the European Commission and inclusion in the EU joint procurement of medical equipment (521) to support the Western Balkans in addressing the COVID-19 pandemic (534, 533, 532,)**, **calls for an inclusion of all Western Balkan countries in the EU Solidarity Fund (518) and reiterates that aid to our partners must be accompanied by a robust communication campaign (529);**

**COMP 34) (AMs 537, 538, 541, 542, 544)**

25. Stresses that the COVID-19 crisis could destabilise countries in Africa which often have a fragile health infrastructure and high debts **acting as a "conflict multiplier" (542);** calls for the EU presence in Africa **EU-Africa cooperation (537)** to be strengthened **and more effectively coordinated,**(538), for **expanding private investment,** financial assistance and recovery plans to be fostered and for an alternative to Chinese investments to be provided; **calls for the EU to continue an enhanced dialogue leading to the holding of the EU-Africa Summit(537) working to build Africa into a long-term, reliable, and close partner of the EU; (541);**

**COMP 35 (25a new) (53, 299, 409, 531, 545, 550, 551, 552, 553, 547,557, 560)**

25a new. **Considers that the relations between the EU and Latin America and the Caribbean are of strategic and crucial interest (550), stresses that Latin America was one of the hardest-hit regions by the COVID-19 pandemic (552), calls on the Commission to keep engaging with Latin American countries (551, 553), establish enhanced cooperation to tackle the COVID-19 (557), help with the recovery plans (531) and support these countries politically with a view to preventing their excessive dependence on aid from other geopolitical players (547); calls on the European Union and its Member States to implement the Agenda 2030 and the Sustainable Development Goals as a roadmap for the recovery (409);**

**COMP 36 (AMs 411,433, 462, 568, 571, 572, 443)**

26. **Notes that the current COVID-19 pandemic had a negative impact on the existing CSDP missions, notably on EU training missions in places such as Mali, Somalia or the Central African Republic (568), reminds that European presence and credible commitment is crucial in mitigating the humanitarian and socio-economical consequences of the COVID-19 pandemic (572),** Calls for the common security and defence policy (CSDP) missions tasked with conflict prevention or mitigation to be strengthened, notably those in the EU's immediate neighbourhood, to help stabilise already fragile settings and prevent a relapse in conflicts and violence due to additional tensions caused by COVID-19; **calls on the Member States to make more civilian and military personnel available for such missions and operations; (571)** and calls in this regard for a swift adoption of the European Peace Facility; **urges the EEAS to work on the resilience and sustainability of CSDP missions and operations during crises like the COVID-19 pandemic;**

*insists on the importance of maintaining the continuity of CSDP missions and operations in such context; calls for a full review of the impact of COVID-19 on the preparedness, readiness, force generation, safety of personnel and continuity of CSDP Operations and Missions (433);*

**COMP 37 (para 27) (AMs 583, 584, 585, 579)**

27. Is of the opinion that the COVID-19 crisis has highlighted certain weaknesses of our Union and has shown the urgent need for an effective, efficient and **autonomous (585) Union both internally and on the world stage (584), with mechanisms for preventing and combating crises, including with financial instruments (579)**; believes that the Conference on the Future of Europe will provide a good platform to move forward in constructing more efficient decision making in EU external policies; is therefore determined to start the Conference as soon as possible;

**COMP 38 (27b new) (AMs 125, 484, 575, 576)**

27b new. **Welcomes the EU's rejection of vaccine nationalism (575), reiterates that the EU has a leading role to play in facilitating access to vaccines in an equitable manner for all people across the world (125) Calls on the EU Commission to work with its international partners to ensure that no one will be left behind once a vaccine will be made available (576, 484);**

**COMP 39 (27a new) (AMs 122, 371, 502, 535, 554, 556, 569)**

27a new. **Notes the impact that COVID-19 on more vulnerable regions, including conflict regions and least developed countries (554); urges the VP/HR to push for local and regional ceasefires and truce agreements and support the initiative of the UNSG Antonio Guterres for a global ceasefire; recalls the need to comply with the humanitarian principles of impartiality and neutrality in the delivery of aid, including in response to COVID-19 related needs (371, 122) calls on the EU to defend humanitarian accesses to remote conflict zones (556) promoting humanitarian corridors (535) and underlines that any external action in conflict-affected countries needs to be based on a conflict-sensitive risk and vulnerability assessment, including the perspectives of women and a special focus on peacebuilding (569);**

**Recitals:**

**COMP 40 Recital A (AMs 25, 26, 27, 28, 29, 34, 41, 61, 63, 73)**

A. whereas COVID-19 has caused a global pandemic, which is affecting millions of human lives, giving rise to an unprecedented global health, economic, social and humanitarian crisis, **triggering systemic tensions of global governance (25) with far-reaching and long-term consequences on international relations (26, 29), affecting key aspects of EU foreign policy and security and defence inside and outside the European Union (27, 28); whereas the EU was the target of disinformation, cyberattacks and other malign third-party interference with the intention to destabilize the EU institutions and the Member states (61, 73)\_**



**COMP 41 Recital Aa new (30, 31, 32, 33, 35, 39, 71, 36, 52, 44, 43, 53)**

*Aa new. whereas the pandemic disproportionately affects the most vulnerable countries, (31) and whereas some countries worldwide have not reacted and have not taken swift and adequate security measures to curb the epidemic (32); whereas the Chinese government downplayed the initial Covid-19 outbreak (35); whereas narratives stressing geography rather than medical terminology to refer to COVID-19 are stigmatizing (71); whereas the virus has killed around a million people globally (33) and demonstrated that only through coordination and solidarity between countries can be controlled and mitigated (39);*

**COMP 42 Recital B (46, 47, 48, 54, 55, 60, 62, 66, 70)**

*B. whereas the EU has a responsibility to act as a global player and adjust its **priorities and policy, including (47)** foreign policy in line with the **changing geopolitical situation in the world and the global (48)** fight against COVID-19; **whereas the EU has to lead, in a predictable manner and by respecting its commitment to fundamental freedoms and rule of law, in multilateral and international efforts (55) and identifies its position in the global economy (60); whereas COVID 19 crisis reveals once more the need to strengthen multilateralism and the rules-based order to better address global challenges (62,55);***

**COMP 43 Recital Bb (57, 58, 64, 71)**

*Bb new. whereas the pandemic and its economic and social effects can further contribute to political grievances deriving from perceived inequality and marginalisation (58), whereas the global economic decline has had a particularly severe impact on the most vulnerable economies (57), whereas the COVID-19 outbreak has exacerbated the persistent problem of medicine shortages globally, with acute consequences in developing countries (64)*

**COMP 44 Recital Ba ((37, 50 , 51, 65, 68 , 69, 72,)**

*Ba new. whereas the pandemic has aggravated the critical humanitarian situation of vulnerable people notably in conflict zones, refugee camps and fragile states (69) and among indigenous communities (51); whereas the EU echoed the United Nations' appeal for an immediate global ceasefire (72) and to ease sanctions amid pandemic to not impede the delivery of essential equipment and supplies necessary to fight the coronavirus (69); whereas we witness a consecutive decline in global liberties and democracy that further strains a multilateral order that is already in crisis (37, 65);*
