I hope this finds you well.

I am writing to propose a meeting at your earliest convenience to discuss CCS in the EU with a focus on the Net Zero Industry Act (NZIA) and the upcoming Industrial Carbon Management (ICM) strategy.

As Shell, we support the role of CCS in achieving climate neutrality by 2050. The NZIA, coupled with the ICM strategy, has the potential to support the business case for investment in CCS. As the EU Institutions enter the final phase of negotiations, we would welcome the opportunity to share our views on how it could be further strengthened to that end.

Shell is one of the pioneers of the technology, with CCS projects across the globe. We are currently developing two CCS projects in Europe in joint partnerships – Northern Lights in Norway and Aramis in the Netherlands. Aramis, with TotalEnergies, EBN and Gasunie could help advance towards the proposed CO2 injection capacity ambition in NZIA. We are also involved in the development of Porthos as a first-moving customer and in the Delta Rhine Corridor.
